Investing is a word we readily use, from investing our time to investing our money. When we invest we 'provide or endow someone or something with a particular quality or attribute'. AAUW, with the support of its members, has been investing in women and girls in our community since 1881.

We are fortunate in October to welcome two speakers who have benefited from AAUW programs. **Shannon Cholakian** is a fourth-year human development major at CSULB. She is secretary of the Student Government's president cabinet, is a third-year resident assistant, and is developing CSULB's first AAUW student affiliate branch. She hopes to found her own nonprofit one day.

Shannon is a member of the AAUW National Student Advisory Council which is composed of 10 college women from throughout the U.S. who demonstrate exceptional leadership. The program provides an opportunity for students to actively participate in women's advocacy, sharpen their leadership skills, and take action for women's equality on their campuses. Shannon attended Tech Trek camp when in middle school, returned as a peer counselor and served as a dorm mom this summer at the San Diego camp and one of the Santa Barbara camps.



Keun Ah (Nari) Ryu is an International Fellowship recipient from South Korea. Her Fellowship is partially funded by interest from the Long Beach branch Anna Stofflet Townsend International Endowment. Nari is working toward a Ph.D. in Chemistry at UC, Irvine. She works on modifying



small molecules to control the activation of immune cells to better understand how immune stimulants, like vaccines, activate our immune system.

Ms. Cholakian and Ms. Ryu will speak about the impact of AAUW mentoring and financial support on achieving their goals. In today's fast-paced always-connected world, we will have the opportunity to hear from two young women who are aspiring to do great things.



Pay Equity-California Moves Forward

"California's new Fair Pay Act...may be the nation's most aggressive attempt yet to close the salary gap between men and women" L.A. Times Sept 2, 2015.

The bill closes loopholes that previously prevented enforcement of existing anti-discrimination laws. It awaits Gov. Brown's signature. The bill ensures that male and female employees who perform 'substantially similar' work receive equal pay, even if their job titles aren't the same or if the work is in different offices for the same employer AND employees would be able to ask about wages without fear of retaliation from employers. Closing these two loopholes "makes California's law the most powerful in the nation".

Hooray for AAUW and other women's organizations and equality advocates who have been lobbying for closing loopholes for years! The effort is paying off. We must pay attention and take action whenever possible!

Board and Branch Business



Regular Board business was conducted at the August Executive Committee meeting. The following motions were made and approved:

- By Direction of the Finance Committee, Deloris Mayuga moved that the Building #1 Fund CD, maturing on July 30, 2015, in the amount of \$43,000 be rolled over to a 6-month CD at OneWest Bank at the current rate of interest.
- Raquel Sanchez moved that the Branch permits fundraising for the AAUW Funds throughout the 2015-2016 year. The motion was seconded by Linda Patten.
- Pat Ferrer moved that Tech Trek be permitted to do its annual fundraiser for Camper Scholarships in January 2016. The motion was seconded by Raquel Sanchez.
- Deloris Mayuga moved that the Finance Committee recommends that AAUW-LB authorize Spectrum Asset Management, Inc. to change AAUW-LB's asset allocation by selling a pro-rata amount of GNMA Bond EFT, Vanguard Short-Term Fund and Prudential Short Term Corp Bond Fund and buy Schwab US Large Cap Growth EFT so that the equities would be approximately 30% of the allocation and bonds would be approximately 70% of the allocation.
