### Women and Wealth: What You Need to Know

Money matters, and for women, we are at even greater risk if 1) we don't have stable finances, 2) we are not confident in our financial literacy, and 3) we don't have our finances in order. Research shows that 90% of women will be solely responsible for their own or their family's finances at some point in their lives due to the death of a spouse, divorce, ailing parents or other reason; yet women



across the board report lower levels of financial knowledge and confidence than men.<sup>1</sup> <sup>2</sup>

To compound the matter even more, women have a longer life expectancy. Since women live longer, we also tend to face higher medical costs in retirement. Today, women are twice as likely as men to live below the poverty line during retirement, with single and women of color struggling the most.<sup>3</sup>

Since the 2000s, the majority of Americans are living paycheck to paycheck, especially women. With a

gender pay gap, women are not only short changed in their take-home pay, but the negative long term effects impact social security benefits, retirement savings, and ability to build credit and reduce debt, especially student loans. A 2015 poll by Fidelity Investments indicated that only 47% of women feel confident talking about money and investments with a financial professional and 80% reported refraining at some point in their lives from talking about their finances to people they are close with. With an uncertain future and national landscape becoming more slanted against women, now is the time to end our paralysis and take the next step in building and securing our future.

Our November program features AAUW member and financial advisor **Lynn Shrum**. Currently Lynn is the Second Vice President, Financial Advisor with Morgan Stanley Smith Barney Wealth Management. She has provided financial strategy seminars for women for 34 years. #### **Update on Meeting Reservations** by Daphne Ching-Jackson, Meetings Coordinator 5

As we prepare for the November 4th Branch meeting which will also be a buffet breakfast at The Grand, we wanted to provide an update to assist with your planning:

- $\cdot$  It is necessary to increase the cost of breakfast to \$23.50, a \$1.50 increase will provide gratuity for the waitpersons. For the September meeting we were unaware that a 22% production fee that is charged only covers the set-up of tables, and not a gratuity. At the September meeting the waitpersons were available to provide some assistance such as retrieving the requested vegetarian meal, refill beverages, and answer questions when needed whether solicited or unsolicited. We hope you will understand.
- There is no policy for "pay at the door". At the September meeting we had a higher number of "walk-in" guests. This became a challenge for the registration and collection of money for those guests who had indicated they would "pay at the door". We had instances of guests reserving a meal and indicating paying at the door but did not attend at the last minute. Long Beach Branch has a policy that once you make a commitment, you are responsible for fulfilling the financial responsibility...it's important to pay for all meals reserved. Although this wasn't a major problem it seems prudent to mitigate such instances by not having a pay at the door option. The number of guests attending is given one week before the meeting. We have very little room to wiggle. Once the number of meal reservations are called in along with the program and meeting only reservations, we must have sufficient funds to pay the vendor.
- · In addition, some guests did not check-in at registration, making it uncertain who the guest is, if paid or not, and if paying, what amount to collect. A thorough up to date reservations list provides all recorded reservations ahead of time, but does not cover "walk-in" guests. Everyone please check in at registration with George Jackson and his team of volunteers. If you have a guest attending, please ask them to check in at the registration desk.
- $\cdot$  In the event you have forgotten to pay for your meal reservation by the deadline you have following options starting in November:
- o Email or call Lee Tsao that you are attending, and reserving a meal. Put a check in the mail prior to the meeting or go to PayPal to fulfill the associated financial commitment.
- o If you want to attend without a meal reservation, send in your check or pay through PayPal.
- o Remember, it's always a good practice to be aware of the deadline and send in your check and reservation on a timely basis or just go to PayPal.

The Board wants everyone to attend the meetings and find it an enjoyable experience. Please be mindful of these procedures so that everyone has a positive experience. Thank you!
