Women at Work— in Art and Theatre

Sparking Curiosity was a three year community based theatre research project directed by Andrea Caban, Head of Voice & Speech in the Theatre Arts Department at California State University, Long Beach (CSULB). Each year, a group of CSULB and Long Beach High School students were cast as researcher/performers. The group identified core questions, then interviewed and transcribed conversations with subjects to investigate and embody their research questions. Year one of the project focused on the family, specifically mothers. Year two expanded the scope to community. For year three, the project expanded further asking a global question: How do women around the world define, engage in and get compensated for work? Caution: Women at Work was the culminating theatrical event. Interviewees include a Swedish

woman on the first international AIDS research team, an Iraqi lawyer, a homemaker from Botswana and a Chilean actress, among others. This arts-based research brings into consciousness inequities workforce women face and creates space for dialogue.



Our March program on March 8th, in honor of International Women's Day features Andrea Caban and four performers from *Sparking Curiosity* performing an excerpt from *Caution: Women at Work*. Please join us for dinner and a show. This is definitely a program that you won't want to miss!





President's Message

March is Women's History month and there have been so many women pioneers breaking ground for the advancement of women. Tenacity and perseverance were, and are, only two of many things required of these courageous women. One example is Dr. Elizabeth Blackwell, who was born in England in 1821 and moved with her family to the United States as a young child. She studied privately with male doctors who supported her cause. After being rejected by 29 medical schools, Blackwell was finally admitted to New York's Geneva Medical College as a joke. The admissions committee thought that a rival school had submitted the application as a prank. It was no joke when she graduated at the top of her class in 1849. This made her the first woman to graduate from an American medical school. Unable to find work because no institution would hire her, she won the support of the Society of Friends, called the Quakers, who began referring patients to her. Because no one would rent space to her,



she purchased a house in New York and opened an office in 1852; four years later, this one-room dispensary became the New York Infirmary for Women and Children.

We hope you will attend the meeting on March 8th when we will recognize past presidents of the branch. These women are another example of dedicated women who worked diligently to make sure the branch thrived and grew.

It isn't too late to reserve a spot at the AAUW State convention. If you aren't able to attend the entire weekend, you can attend for one day, as it's conveniently located in Irvine and will be a short drive. Use of Endowment Fund Interest

As was reported at the February 3 Branch meeting, all AAUW Branch Members should be thinking of how to use the Endowment Fund Interest. This an annual opportunity to suggest to the Board and members of the Branch how the Branch can apply the interest earned on Certificates of Deposit. The interest is earned from a principal of \$33,000 in the Endowment Fund that's invested in a Certificate of Deposit with Banc of California. This CD will mature on June 3.2018 and the interest is estimated to be **\$425**, based on 1.29%.

The fund was started many years ago by AAUW members who left a part of their estate to Long Beach Branch upon their passing. Please give some thought to which activity you want to designate. Some suggestions in past years include Tech Trek, STEM Conference, scholarships, using Facebook ads to promote the annual author's luncheon or to recruit new members. Daphne Ching-Jackson moved that the Mid-Year Budget Report and revisions to the 2017-18 Budget be accepted and filed for audit. The motion passed.




