

It's June Already?! - Time Flies, Like Shirley Muldowney!

Shirley Muldowney, "also known as the "First Lady of Drag Racing", was the first woman to be licensed by the National Hotrod Association, and the first to drive a top fuel dragster. She won a staggering 18 NHRA events during her career. Muldowney noted, "NHRA fought me every inch of the way, but when they saw how a girl could fill the stands; they saw I was good for the sport." Shirley left school at the age of 16 and started racing at 18. Her best time for the quarter mile was set in 2001 at an International Hot Rod Assn race. She drove it in 4.64 seconds at 320.20 mph!

AAUW – Long Beach Branch once again exceeded our July 2018 Board Retreat expectations! Despite the loss of four long-time members and those who chose not to renew last June, we have recruited 10 new members, who participated in various Interest Groups, Work Smart and the STEM Career Conference. We love that our newer members bring new ideas and are willing to engage. Thanks to all of you who have invited guests to programs and events!

The Branch was recognized in March by the CSULB President's Commission for the Status of Women for our years-long collaboration with the university on various projects over the years, including our annual scholarship program and Start Smart, a student-oriented salary/benefits training opportunity. AAUW CA also lauded our 16-year **STEM Career Conference** efforts with an award received at the CA State AAUW Conference in April! Sixteen years into offering our STEM Career Conference to seven Long Beach middle schools, we hosted our 2,440th student at the February event! Eight sponsors helped to fund the project, over 60 volunteers helped out, and ten experts in their fields shared what it takes to work in their respective careers. Thank you to coordinating team Frances Rozner, Mary Lamo and Raquel Sanchez, and all the volunteers. Thank you, Carol Llewellyn for hosting the post-conference meal once again! We have launched the online survey for the evaluation of the program with the help of consulting firm MissionQuest.

AAUW Work Smart has provided negotiation skill building for 382 participants in classes since October 2016.

A Spanish version is under development. Thank you to our planning team (Frances Rozner, Mary Lamo, and Sharon Westafer) and all the volunteers who facilitated, scheduled, signed in attendees, took photos, and procured funding! Pam Rayburn, with the help of Terri Armstrong (Communications Coordinator/Career Advisor), hosted an **AAUW Start Smart** class. It's a salary and benefits negotiation workshop on the CSULB campus for students starting in their careers. The Branch is confident that **Irvine Tech Trek** will continue to provide diverse opportunities to local girls this summer, and therefore sponsored ten students for the summer course again this year!

The financial health of the Branch is strong. Kudos to Deloris Mayuga and Daphne Ching Jackson!

Members also generously contributed to Tech Trek, AAUW Fund, Branch projects and for scholarships at the Authors' Luncheon, Tech Trek and Fund donations, International City Theatre fundraiser, Opportunity Draws, and the Ex-Its (the past presidents' group donated money in memory of deceased past Branch presidents). Thank you to Sonya Jackson, Mary Ann Takemoto, Ellen Mathis, Frances Rozner, Pat Ferrer, Anne Supple, Judy Willis, and to the many volunteers and donors who make this happen.



Communication has been terrific this year thanks to Gail Morrison's timely submissions monthly to various news outlets regarding meetings, events, awards and project accomplishments. Four Reasons for Optimism on the Pay Gap

AAUW CEO Kim Churches contributed an article on *MBSNC's Know Your Value* website about the role of salary transparency in advancing equity. Here's why she's feeling encouraged:

- Secrecy policies are changing. Laws in 18 states and Washington, D.C., now ban employers from prohibiting salary discussions.
- Workers are negotiating better. Websites like Salary.com are giving job candidates the data they need, and AAUW's free **Work Smart** online course provides tips for making the ask.
- Employers are doing their part. More leaders are opting to share information about compensation decisions with employees which is believed to narrow the pay gap. And companies like software and technology company SAP have made public commitments to pay equity.
- People are talking. According to AAUW's poll, 57 percent of Americans reported they have or would discuss their pay with coworkers.

AAUW Work Smart

The April workshop had 13 participants, bringing the total program attendees to 382. One attendee drove from Santa Barbara on the advice of a friend who is a long-time AAUW member – and was very glad he did; he left with a solid strategy for increasing his pay with his current employer. Another attendee, transitioning to a new career, wrote to us later: "I can tell you



that I am honestly looking forward to negotiating a salary in the near future. You are doing so many great things to support women, myself included, in their careers and in the workplace!" These live workshops provide the opportunity to get questions answered and to role-play techniques with another human being. They do build confidence and we provide the CA equal pay law facts.

AAUW will receive an additional \$500,000 from Coca-Cola if 100,000 individuals take (or at least start) the online course by August 22. This money will be used to develop an online Work Smart course specifically for hourly paid workers. The AAUW Work Smart skills learned are transferrable to other negotiable interactions – so even if you are retired, consider taking the online course, at **salary.aauw.org.** Please share the site broadly. Member Deloris Mayuga shared it with her son and he found it very helpful in his salary negotiations for a job.

A few program details: The June 27th workshop will use the new 2019 curriculum. PIHRA (Professionals in Human Resources Association) in Long Beach, placed our flyers on their luncheon tables for 70 attendees in April and we're still seeking sponsors for future workshops (\$600 each).
