Women are making headway – the new annual income figure is 82% of what a man earns – 2% more than in the last few years. AAUW met its goal of more than 100,000 women taking the online AAUW Work Smart course. Here in Long Beach, we've held 8 workshops in 2019, with 97 attendees for a program total of 421. Thank you for supporting the over 400 women who needed the assistance to improve their financial futures and received it through our branch's efforts.

The Thursday evening, October 3 workshop had 25 registrants with 8 women attending. One of the young women who attended found out about the workshop through a Google search for "assertiveness training". The workshop does assist with confidence! Stelet Kim and Mary Lamo assisted, with Charlotte Joseph facilitating. It was sponsored by Raquel Sanchez and Sharon Westafer. At CSULB, Terri Armstrong has scheduled an **AAUW Start Smart workshop on October 29**.
