Angeles. She enjoys sharing vignettes on US First Ladies as well as Women in Film and Women during the Civil War.

A lover of travel, she has visited all 7 continents and for many years she and Charlotte Joseph led tours to Washington DC and Europe. In 2014 she started her company, Ginny's Getaways, in which she pays her own way and gives her commission to charities; AAUW (Long Beach Branch) STEM and Work Smart being two of many recipients.



"Human trafficking is modern-day slavery and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act. It is estimated that human trafficking generates many billions of dollars of profit per year, second only to drug trafficking as the most profitable form of transnational crime. One in three teens is recruited with 48 hours of running away from home or foster care. Guest speakers were advocates Mary White, Executive Director of *Gems Uncovered*, a local Long Beach nonprofit, and Melodie Fox, educator, advocate and author of *Freedom Has a Name: My Name is Also Freedom: The Shari Ho Story.* They related the experiences of abused and trapped women living in fear and shared their efforts to help those caught up in this silent web. Ways to identify and assist these victims were explored."

The second program award came under the category of STEM/ STEAM, and it was for the Tech Trek program at the February 28<sup>th</sup> branch meeting! Again, Charlotte submitted the following program description. "AAUW – Long Beach has been sponsoring young women to attend Tech Trek Camps since the program was founded by AAUW – CA in 1988. For girls, the weeklong camp sparks their curiosity and places them on a path toward success in STEM fields. This program welcomed back three



former Tech Trek participants who shared the life-changing impact of this program. The speakers were Rachel Thompson, a Ph.D. candidate in Physical Therapy at CSULB who attended Tech Trek 10 years ago, Gech Huong Huv, a high school senior at CA Academy of Math & Science (CAMS), Long Beach Unified School District, who attended four years ago and is heading to the University of San Francisco with a major in Environmental Engineering, and Karintha Marshall who attended the very first Tech Trek Camp 20 years ago and now heads the IT department at a nonprofit organization. These ladies have excelled in their fields and have received multiple recognitions for their scholarship and efforts to make a difference in their communities."

# Feminist Activists

#### **DOROTHY PITMAN-HUGHES and GLORIA STEINEM** - almost 50 years later.

Feminist activists Dorothy Pitman-Hughes and Gloria Steinem raised their fists in solidarity while posing for photographer Dan Wynn. The iconic pose of women's empowerment and the ongoing struggle for equal rights first ran in Esquire Magazine. More than 45 years later St. Augustine, Florida photographer Daniel Bagan, created an updated image. Decades after their partnership, speaking on intersectional feminism, and the founding of Ms. Magazine and the Women's Action Alliance, their impact has not waned.

They are women in their 70's, again standing side by side with fists raised, adding a message of equal rights that resonates with power for a new generation. Again their message has not

dimmed with age.



The Smithsonian National Portrait Gallery, in October 2017, acquired this portrait into its collection, validating the historic significance of their black power salute of equal rights for women and minorities. This defiant black power salute helps open us to dialogue on sexism and racism that is still vitally needed today. It truly demonstrates their continued hope for positive change.

Steinem and Pitman-Hughes remain an inspiration to activists across the country as they continue to push for racism and gender equality. A hundred years of the suffrage movement has not eliminated racism, classism and sexism.

Even decades later, their power and beauty show no sign of age, just wisdom reflected in their soft smiles.

# Just Dues & More

As Membership Treasurer, I have been asked two questions: Why should I pay dues? What do I get for paying dues? I can easily give my response, but I wanted to know how National would answer these questions, and I found the following compelling reasons:

"Annual dues currently account for 13 percent of AAUW's annual budget. They help to sustain and grow AAUW's programs and work that advances equity for women and girls. We believe we can do great things together and thank you for your continued support. When you join AAUW, you invest in yourself and in the power of a community." (source: AAUW website 02/25/2019)

In April you received an email with the subject "AAUW Membership Renewal for Fiscal Year 2021" from AAUW National. The email contained specific information about your membership and included the two pieces of information you needed to renew your membership:

1) an MSD (Member Services Database) link to renew online and 2) how to pay by check. You can use the link to update your member record and contact information (except name changes contact connect@aauw.org); make a contribution; track your membership; and get history for tax purposes. Additionally, you can view our branch's member roster and leader contacts.

**2021 Membership Renewal is \$105**, with \$59 for National dues, \$20 for AAUW CA dues, and \$26 for LB Branch dues. The National Paid Life Member membership is a one-time tax-deductible amount of \$1180. Undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled in AAUW partner universities and colleges (which includes most of our local universities and colleges) benefit with FREE AAUW National and AAUW memberships. Undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled in NON-AAUW partner universities or colleges will pay \$18.81 in annual National dues, plus \$10 AAUW CA dues. These students can then join our Branch for only \$13.

The Long Beach Branch participates in "Shape the Future" campaigns, giving new members who join at a public event a 50% discount to National dues; and "Give a Grad a Gift" program which gives AAUW members the opportunity to gift one year of National dues to a recent college grad. 


