What is the Frances Magarian Scholarship?

 Established in 2013 from monies bequeathed to the Branch from Frances Magarian

• Awards:

- Two scholarships of \$2500 each awarded to two recipients from California State University, Long Beach (CSULB)
- Two scholarships of \$500 each awarded to two recipients from Long Beach City College (LBCC)







Criteria for Scholarship

- Minimum eligibility, students must be undergraduates:
 - Enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester units (full-time) and attending CSULB or LBCC respectively
 - Have successfully completed a minimum of 24 units with a grade of C or better
 - Be in good standing at all colleges attended and have an overall undergraduate grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher with grades of C or better
- Award Criteria:
 - Application Requirements
 - Academic Excellence official transcripts
 - Activities and Leadership looking for alignment with AAUW mission
 - Letters of Recommendation
 - Essay
 - Interview

Their Accomplishments

- 27 scholarships awarded between 2014 2021
 - \$35,500 in scholarships funded
- From 2014-2020:
 - Of the 14 LBCC recipients:
 - 10* graduated with an Associates Degrees and 8 pursuing/graduated with a Bachelors Degree
 - Of the 9 CSULB recipients:
 - 8* graduated with a Bachelor's Degree and 6 pursuing/graduated with an advanced degree

Their Accomplishments

- From 2014-2020:
 - Of the 18 scholarship recipients:
 - 10 received/in progress degree in STEM fields
 - Advanced degrees received/in progress include Doctor of Physical Therapy; Master's Degree in Women Studies, Legal Studies, Education; Juris Doctor
- Of our 2020 recipients from LBCC, even with the COVID-19 pandemic challenges, they graduated from LBCC and are attending CSULB and USC

Allison Greenlea




- Scholarship recipient in 2016

The Ask

- A recommendation from the Board of Directors to the Branch to authorize the following funding for the AAUW Long Beach Frances Magarian Scholarship Program for the next five years:
 - 1. Authorize the use of 100% of the net income from any Author's Day Event,
 - 2. If not sufficient, from the Reserve Fund,
 - 3. If still not sufficient, from personal solicitation,
 - 4. As a last resort, from the principal of the Endowment Fund, not to exceed \$30,000.
