Public Policy

AAUW CA SPONSORS CALIFORNIA LEGISLATION

Guided by our member-approved Public Policy Priorities for 2021-2023, the AAUW California Public Policy Committee has selected the bills that we will be supporting as they move through the 2022 Session of the California Legislature. Here are the six highest priority bills:

- AB 92—creates an equitable sliding scale for family fees to alleviate the burden on working families struggling to pay for childcare and early childhood education services. Co-sponsor
- AB 1666—enables persons to come from outside California for abortions and not be impacted by laws of other states. Co-sponsor
- AB 1968—mandates the creation of websites at CSU/UC campuses to assist sexual assault survivors.
- AB 2881—Student parents get priority enrollment, registration, and access to basic needs centers, enabling them to remain in California colleges.
- SB 523—Expands contraceptive coverage by requiring health plans to provide point-of-sale coverage without cost-sharing.
- SB 1375—updates statutes relating to abortion care to allow nurse practitioners to practice under standard protocols to provide first-trimester abortion care. Within our Public Policy Priorities, six bills are related to Economic Security for All Women, seven are related to Equal Access to Public Education, and 18 are related to Social and Racial Justice for all Members of Society.

AAUW California is experiencing greater visibility among elected legislators by sponsoring/ co-sponsoring bills.

The Public Policy Committee members spent many hours in March researching bills, and in discussions over two days, to select bills to support. AAUW members are working to improve the lives of women and children in California!

Branch Co-President, Ginny Baxter, welcomed 221 middle school girls to the 18th Annual STEM Career Conference, held at Sato Academy for Mathematics and Science on February 25th. Principal, Ronnie Coleman added her welcome. Guests, Diana Craighead and Megan Kerr of LBUSD, Board of Education, were introduced, and sponsors were recognized. The Keynote Speaker Taryn Williams, an AAUW Long Beach member with two bachelor degrees from CSULB and currently working on a Ph.D from UC Irvine. talked to the girls about overcoming personal struggles, including being incarcerated, to achieve a successful life.

After the keynote address, the girls each attended two 40-minute workshops led by women in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) careers. The workshops, with fun hands-on activities, were presented by:

Managing Memberships With the Community Hub:

Excerpt from the Board to Board April Newsletter by Carol Holzgrafe, Director

The long wait is over: the Community Hub has arrived - mostly - replacing the old Member Services Database (MSD). All members will need to reset their password. Click <u>HERE</u> to go to the AAUW National website. To access your account, click the "Log In" at the top right corner of the home page. **The first time you log in, you'll need to reset your password by clicking the "Forgot Password" link.** From there you will be directed to your "Personal Snapshot". Do try it. Click <u>HERE</u> for instructions and several tutorials on how to set up your Personal Snapshot, the new term for your personal AAUW portal. (As a current member, you can skip the information in the video on how to add new members.)

Once in your Personal Snapshot, you can click on the various links on the left side and add any appropriate information. Check "My Payment Methods" if you want to pay your dues by either your bank account or your credit card. Look for the 3 dots to the right of each subject to see more options. <u>This is also where</u> you will renew your membership when notified that the renewal process is open and is also the place where you can make donations. National dues will be \$67 for the 2022-23 year, a rise of \$5. Still a bargain.

Managing Memberships Continued:

AAUW National is re-evaluating the renewal process continually. In addition to the instructions above, National is also considering sending renewal notices in a similar manner as last year (receive renewal email, click link, pay by credit card). More information to follow.

Finally, new members who join will be on a rolling expiration system. Their 12 month membership period will extend from their join date through the last day of their join month the following year. Ex. A member who joins on 4/15/2022 will have a membership expiration of 4/30/2023. Going forward, new members will receive a full 12 month membership regardless of when they join! <u>All current members' expiration dates will remain the same</u>, therefore, most members' renewal date is June 30, 2022 for the 2022-23 year.
