# From the Co-Presidents

Early in my term, I went through a tragic family loss that only a couple branch members knew about, along with being at the receiving end of a very public political anathematizing campaign and dealing with severe family health crisis. It was one thing after another and a year of personal and professional tumult and arduous odyssey. What was significant in helping me survive it all, was the love, compassion,



patience of my co-president, Denise Montoya, and many of my AAUW Long Beach branch members who gave me the warmth of their love, light and support.

Many young professional ladies' stories may align with mine. They may have two jobs like me, they may have child care issues, they may take care of their elder family members as main care givers, they may have experienced loss in their families, and alas may be just getting by to make ends meet for their families. Young professionals may not always be supplicants to rigor and as learned as some of the veteran members on process and protocol, but they truly need and yearn for organizations such as ours that can support them personally and professionally. If we want to support and foster a spirit of diversity, inclusion, and equity, we need to continue to exercise patience, pliability and pure compassion and meet working professionals where they are, akin to what was afforded to me by the loving kindness of so many in the branch.

Let us support our incoming Co-Presidents and Board by continuing to promote a loving and growing community focused on building a more accepting union for our members and our posterity. I submit that perhaps it's best to choose substance over form and to keep in mind the old adage that "perfect is the enemy of good" and a salient detractor that conjures resignation. And we hope to have fun and create joy while we are at it! I don't know about you but I am pretty excited for the year ahead. I look forward to helping our membership become more inclusive and diverse, while learning from the great insight and experience of so many of you who have been members for decades!

Thank you for the warmth of your love, the gift of your attention, and the opportunity to serve as your work - inprogress Co-President. It has been a true pleasure and privilege.


# Past-President Recognition Invitation

## Amal El Wardi is a Career Development Grant recipient funded in part from our Long Beach Branch, Inc. Research and Projects Endowment (#4289) which was established in 2005 and completed in 2008.

This grant provides \$2,000-\$20,000 funding to women who hold a BA and are preparing to advance or change careers or re-enter the workforce in education; health and medical sciences; science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM); or social sciences. Primary consideration is given to women of color and women pursuing their first advanced degree or credentials in nontraditional fields. Funds are available for tuition, fees, books, supplies, local transportation and dependent care. Grants support course work beyond a bachelor's degree, including a master's degree,

second bachelor's degree, certification program or specialized training in technical or professional fields. Course work must be taken at a college or university in the US or at a technical school accredited by the U.S. Department of Education. Funds are not available for doctorate-level work.

\*\* Note: "AAUW National dues for FY24 will be \$72 in accordance with the three-year increase implemented by the AAUW Board of Directors back in October 2020. This rate becomes effective in the system on April 1st." With this change our annual dues will be \$118 (National \$72, State \$20, Branch \$26) instead of \$113 paid in FY23.
