#### AAUW MEMBERSHIP DUES RENEWAL PROCESS

Many of our branch members first joined AAUW prior to April 2022. If you are among this group, your membership dues for 2024-2025 are due on June 30<sup>th</sup>. The rest of the members will have dues payable on different dates throughout the year. (Disclaimer: If you were in another branch prior to joining LB, your exact due date may be different.) Be aware that national will send you three monthly reminders to renew your membership. This means you have a three-month grace period past your membership expiration before national removes your name from the membership data base. Furthermore, AAUW Long Beach Policies and Procedures stipulates that dues must be paid by August 15 in order for a member to be included in the yearbook for a given fiscal year.

As a friendly reminder, you will also receive a direct email from the Membership Treasurer 30 days prior to your membership expiration date. The email will include a downloadable, "Membership Renewal Instructions" document. Where practical, at least one follow up phone call will be made to you.

Members are *strongly encouraged* to pay their dues, using credit or debit cards, via AAUW's Community Hub <u>https://my.aauw.org/NC\_Login</u>. If you cannot access the Community Hub and must pay by check, please send your check for \$118, made payable to "AAUW Long Beach", to: Dr Ginny Baxter P.O. Box 8313, Long Beach CA 90808.

The following three motions were passed by unanimous vote at the April 6, 2024 Branch Meeting:

Bylaws Motion by Frances Rozner: "I move, by the direction of the Board, that the Branch approve the recommended updates to the Policies 3 Procedures # 13, Nominations Committee and #14, Exec. Committee/Board of Directors".

If the transfer is recommended and approved by the Board, the Investment Vice President will transfer AAUW Long Beach Branch Endowment Fund fiscal year earnings defined as interest, dividends, and realized capital gains to the Reserve Fund no later than Aug. 31st. h. These procedures may be amended with the approval of the board of directors and branch membership. Motion passed unanimously and will be presented to the branch for approval.

#### Research Publication Grants in Engineering, Medicine and Science

The primary criterion for this grant award is scholarly excellence. Applications are reviewed by distinguished scholars. The award amount is \$10,000-\$35,000, which is paid in two equal payments (beginning and midpoint). The final 10% is contingent upon research results being accepted to a scholarly scientific publication within six



months of the end of the grant year. Grantees must have a doctorate in engineering, medicine or science, be part-time or temporary faculty, new or established researchers at universities, and be on a tenure track. Find further information HERE.

Our Jean Aldrich American Fellowship recipient Dana Harmon will use her fellowship grant to pay core facility fees for metabolomics and transcriptomics; purchase needed computers and lab

equipment for data analysis and "hit" validation; purchase supplies and reagents for validation of metabolomics and transcriptomics findings; and to fund the experiential learning of five diverse undergraduates in the Harmon lab. The students are involved in all aspects of this research project.
