2015-2016 Appointed Officers

Frances Rozner moved that the Board of Directors approve the following 2015-2016 Appointed Officers: Administrative Assistant, Darlene Daclan; Communications Co-Director, Gail Morrison; Communications Co-Director, Brittani Santini-Bolanos; Financial Secretary (2 year), Margaret Huebner; Meetings Co-Coordinator, Pam Rayburn; Meetings Co-Coordinator, Lindsay San Miguel; Membership Treasurer (2 year), Denise Montoya; Parliamentarian, Leah Sakacs; Public Policy Director, Flo Pickett. The motion was seconded by Darci Fersch. The motion passed.

June 6, 2015 Branch Meeting

Updates to Standing Rules

Frances Rozner moved that Standing Rule, Finance, 3c, "The AAUW Long Beach Endowment Fund Administrative Procedures may be amended with the approval of the Board of Directors and Branch membership." be deleted. [It is a duplication of Policies and Procedures, AAUW Long Beach Branch Endowment Fund(s) Administrative Procedures, 8j, "These procedures may be amended with the approval of the Board of Directors and Branch membership."] The motion was seconded by Del Clarke.

The motion passed.

Frances Rozner moved that Standing Rule, Finance, 3d, "The Branch Investment Policy may be amended with the approval of the Board of Directors and the Branch membership." be deleted from the Standing Rules and moved to Policies and Procedures, Long Beach Branch Investment Policy, becoming iii under subsection h. Approval. The motion was seconded by Del Clarke. The motion passed.

Convention Fund

Frances Rozner moved that, by direction of the Executive Committee, Budget (b) in Policies and Procedures be amended, to read: The Convention Fund may pay for travel, registration, lodging and food stipend, for the President-Elect when attending state and national conventions. The same may be paid for the current President when attending the state convention. In odd-numbered years, for as long as the AAUW National Convention is biennial, the Convention Fund may also pay for travel, registration, lodging and a food stipend, for the incoming President-Elect. The motion passed.

Endowment Funds

Pat Ferrer moved that, by direction of the Board of Directors, the Endowment Interest earned (exclusive of that for the Connie Inskeep Leadership Award) for FY 2014-2015, be placed in the Endowment Interest holding fund to be used for a future major project of the Branch. The motion passed.

CD Renewal

Deloris Mayuga moved that, by direction of the AAUW Board of Directors, when the CD matures, the \$83,000 in the Endowment Fund be rolled over into two, one-year Certificate of Deposits at a bank. 33,000 would remain as the Endowment Fund. \$50,000 would be returned to its source, the Building Fund. All accumulated interest should be moved to the Endowment Holding Fund in the Bank of America checking account. The motion passed.

Investment Policy Amendments

Deloris Mayuga moved that, by direction of the AAUW Board of Directors, the Policies and Procedures be amended as follows: Policy 10.b.ii – delete sentence referencing appendix "A"; Policy 10.d.ii – delete sentence referencing appendix "A"; Policy 10.e.ii – change percentages to 1. Equities (30-50%) 2. Fixed Income (50-70%); Policy 10.i – delete Appendix A, and Policy 10.j change number to 10.i. The motion passed.

Budget

Daphne Ching-Jackson moved that, by direction of the Board of Directors, the Branch approve the 2015-2016 operating budget as presented. The motion passed.
